Suggestions for a good Mission:

- ✓ Any paved spots are for 2 tent trailers or 16' and bigger camping trailers or for motor homes.
- ✓ Pick up trucks with a camper shell; please try to park off pavement if possible.
- ✓ If you bring a monstrosity up, make sure you have at least 2 people in it, more if possible. No loners, and if you are, please park up top in the over flow area.
- \checkmark All boat trailers and single cars need to be parked in the overflow area.

- ✓ Don't ever forget earplugs, remember, it's the Mission!

- ✓ Everyone must sign in <u>prior</u> to setting up camp, thank you!
